ADVOCACY



Advocacy

- In partnership with DCMS
 & the Historic Environment
 forum, we held 4 virtual
 Heritage Statement
 Roadshow events, facilitating
 important conversations with
 over 150 members.
- We represented the heritage sector at the Heritage Council.
- We campaigned in the House
 of Lords in response to the then
 Environment Bill, providing
 Peers with comprehensive
 briefings & draft amendments,
 resulting in a commitment on
 the record to including heritage
 in the forthcoming guidance, &
 participation in Ministerial-level
 stakeholder meetings.
- We built our evidence base, publishing an updated Fiscal & Funding Manifesto & sending it to all parliamentarians ahead of the Autumn Statement.

Communications

- We sent 27 issues of <u>Heritage</u>
 <u>Update</u> (supported by the
 HHF), which reached a total
 of 6,712 subscribers.
- Our number of social media followers across Twitter, Facebook and Linkedin rose by nearly 4000 - to a total of 31,293.
- We received 193,596 visits to our new website.
- Our videos on YouTube received **1,855** views.
- The Heritage Funding
 Directory (co-managed with
 the Architectural Heritage
 Fund, supported by the HHF)
 received 59,843 visits. This
 resource remains a useful
 guide to funding & funding
 sources for a range of
 heritage projects.
- We kept our COVID & Brexit guidance hubs up-to-date for the sector.

Sector Support

- 2,796 individuals attended live events from our Heritage Digital project & there were nearly 4000 downloads of the free guides & templates on the project website.
- 1,018 individuals received support through our Rebuilding Heritage programme.
- We held our 2021 Heritage
 Debate on 'Levelling Up'
 (supported by Ecclesiastical
 Insurance) & published
 a series of blogs sharing
 perspectives on the topic from
 across the sector.
- The Historic Environment
 Forum (hosted by the
 Heritage Alliance & funded
 by Historic England) held
 meetings to discuss strategic
 matters for the sector in
 England, and published the
 Heritage Recovery Plan &
 Heritage Responds.

Supporting Our Members

- We reached a total of over 170 members this year, and launched new expert-led and networking roundtables.
- Our first virtual Heritage
 Day brought together
 important keynote speeches,
 thought-provoking
 discussions & new digital
 experiences.
- Our Ecclesiastical's
 Heritage Heroes Awards
 recognised a new category
 of Digital Heritage Heroes
 - volunteers going above &
 beyond to support the sector
 through national lockdowns.
- We held 2 member roundtables on Diversity
 & Inclusion with Historic
 England. These informed our
 UK-wide survey on D&I, to
 which 85 people responsed.
